CECA Workload Trends Survey 2020 Q1

CECA's Workload Trends Survey for 2020 Q1 is now live. Guidance for the Scottish Construction Industry

In case you missed the announcement yesterday, the Scottish Government have now published COVID-19 Guidance for the Scottish Construction Industry which you can read in full here. This guidance comes into effect immediately - 6 April 2020 - and extends until further notice. It will be reviewed in three weeks' time.

The guidance confirms that all work on construction sites, unless it is for crucial and essential work during the coronavirus pandemic, should stop immediately.

Essential projects include:

- Projects to create or repurpose facilities which will be used directly in COVID-19 related
 activities including testing, containment, treatment, research, vaccine production, protective
 equipment manufacture, other key medical supplies, and other related activity, including
 supply chains to those projects.
- Projects to create or repurpose facilities which will be used to accommodate key workers or free-up space in facilities to be used directly in COVID-19 related activities as above.
- Projects to create or repurpose facilities and infrastructure critical to the national response to COVID-19 including food production, distribution and digital communication, where these facilities are likely to be completed and operational within 6 months.

 Projects which are considered essential public services or which will provide wider resilience and capacity across the system

Where essential construction work is taking place, it should take place in strict adherence to the agreed <u>Site Operating Procedures</u> and <u>Scottish Social Distancing Guidance</u>.

SEPA Coronavirus Response

SEPA has relaxed its regulatory approach to help business adapt to the COVID-19 pandemic. New SEPA guidance states that if a regulated business is unable to meet all its obligations under SEPA's licence, permit or other authorisations because of these exceptional circumstances we now face, SEPA expect the business to:

- 1. prioritise compliance with conditions that **directly protect the environment** over those that are indirect controls or more administrative in nature;
- 2. alert us as **early as possible** if it believes it will be unable to meet any obligations and work closely with us on making choices and finding solutions;
- 3. keep a **clear record** of choices made and actions taken.

If a regulated business behaves in line with these principles, SEPA will take a proportionate and reasonable approach to how they assess compliance during the public health emergency. You can read more on SEPA's website here and in Scottish Construction Now here.
