Lockdown Extended for until 28th May

First Minister, Nicola Sturgeon MSP, has today formally announced that the lockdown in Scotland will be extended for another three weeks, until 28th May, when the next review will take place.

The First Minister highlighted the R number is still hovering around 1 just now - which means that any significant easing up of restrictions at this stage "would be very very risky indeed." It is thought that the R number is currently higher in Scotland than it is in other parts of the UK and therefore "extreme caution is needed to avoid a rapid resurgence of the virus". It was restated that all guidance remains the same as it was at the beginning of the outbreak and that businesses and the public should act accordingly.

The only possible change to lockdown measures currently being considered is the one form of exercise a day rule; this may be relaxed to permit exercise more than once a day An announcement on this will be made in the next few days but the FM stated dropping the "Stay at Home" message at this stage would be "catastrophic".

Four nations approach

The First Minister confirmed that there would be a call between the leaders of all four governments today to discuss the way forward. She outlined that it remained her preference to maintain a four nations approach but that this would require all parts of the UK operating at the pace of the slowest. If this is not possible then a regionalized approach will be necessary.
