Job Retention Scheme Updates

The UK Government have updated their Job Retention Scheme guidance:

- Clarification on eligibility <u>here</u>. The update provides additional clarification on which employees you can put on furlough and claim for through the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme, clarifying eligibility based on employment on or after certain dates.
- Updated guidance on how to calculate 80% of your employee's wages, National Insurance contributions (NICs) and pension contributions if you have furloughed staff due to coronavirus (COVID-19) can be found here.
- Amended guidance on how to claim for 80% of your employee's wages, explaining that
 employers will be asked to give the amounts separately for the NICs, pension and wages they
 are claiming for. Find this here.

Changes in the pipeline

It is highly likely that the UK Government will be announcing further changes to the scheme this week, including a possible employer contribution of at least one-fifth of furloughed employees wages and possibly also national insurance contributions. New public health measures for all UK arrivals at the UK border

New measures, at the UK border to guard against a second wave of coronavirus infections have been announced by the UK Home Secretary on Friday 22 May. You can view the full press notice here. These measures are due to come into effect on 8 June 2020. They include 14 days self-isolation for anyone entering the UK, bar a short list of exemptions

The full list is available on GOV.UK and includes:

- road haulage and freight workers, to ensure the supply of goods is not impacted;
- medical professionals who are travelling to help with the fight against coronavirus;
- Anyone moving from within the Common Travel Area, covering Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man;
- Seasonal Agricultural Workers who will self-isolate on the property where they are working.

The changes will be subject to review every three weeks, to ensure they are in line with the latest scientific evidence and remain effective and necessary.
